
Born: 26 February 1892 Milverton, Ontario. Born Russell Wilhelm.

Enlisted: March 1916 with the Red Cross of the 111th Battalion changed his last name to Williams.

Family: Mr. & Mrs. Daniel S. Williams of New Hamburg.

Occupation: Teacher- Previous to enlisting he taught at schools in Wilmot Centre, Baden, and in Galt, Ontario.

After going through the battle of Vimy Ridge he fell a month later being instantly killed by a shell in an attack on enemy trenches.

He was killed in action when sending a message by flag from the Report Centre. He received a direct hit from an enemy shell.

While in England he was granted permission to married Constance Raigner.

He was killed in action by an enemy shell attack on Mount Sorrel.

During an attack at Vimy Ridge he leapt from a trench and was struck down by enemy shrapnel when going "over the top."



Gunner Alvin Jacob Forler

Death: 16 October 1918 Age: 23 years old

Admitted to military hospital in Coquitlam BC and died of Influenza complicated by bronco-pneumonia.



Private Glen Robert Goebel

Death: 21 October 1918 Age: 24 years old

Family: Son of Mrs. F. Goebel of New Hamburg. Known as "Glennie."

He was standing in a doorway of the Battalion Orderly Room in the village of Hanson and was hit in the forehead by shrapnel from an enemy shell that exploded outside the door and was killed instantly.



Private John Elmer Kaster

Private Wilfred Cecil Laschinger

Death: 11 April 1918 Age: 21 years old

Force: Canadian Infantry

Unit: 111th Battalion of South Waterloo and went to France in September 1916.

Buried or Commemorated at: RIVERSIDE CEMETERY New Hamburg, Ontario

Born: 17 March 1897 at New Hamburg, Ontario

Enlisted: 6 March 1916 with 111th Battalion of South Waterloo

Family: Son of late Postmaster Jacob Laschinger of New Hamburg, Ontario.

Occupation: Student

Went to France in September 1916. Due to multiple and severe shrapnel wounds at Vimy Ridge, his left leg was amputated. He was transferred to different military hospitals and died at home in New Hamburg after an operation.

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Private Henry Lorne McFadyen

Death: 10 November 1917 Age: 23 years old

Force: Canadian Infantry (Western Ontario Regiment) Unit: 18th Battalion

Awarded: Distinguished Conduct Medal (D.C.M)

Enlisted: 25 March 1916 as a Private with the 111th Battalion of South Waterloo

Occupation: Teacher at Baden S.S.#13 School

He was awarded the Distinguished Conduct Medal for devotion to duty as a stretcher-bearer. He was killed in action by enemy shell which exploded very close to him in the trenches South of Passchendaele.



Private Ivan Bernard Marty

Death: 6 April 1917 at Vimy Ridge Age: 19 years old

Unit: joined with the 111th Battalion to the 75th Battalion

Enlisted: 12 May 1916 with the 111th Battalion of South Waterloo

Family: Son of Dr. John and Mary Matilda Marty.

Occupation: First year Medical Student, University of Toronto, Ontario.

While doing duty as a stretcher bearer at the battle of Vimy Ridge on April 4, 1917 he received 3 shrapnel wounds in his left hip and died two day later.



Private Albert Edward Merner

Unit: enlisted with the 111th and was transferred to the 75th Battalion

Nearly two weeks before the war ended he was killed in action by an enemy shell exploding within a few feet of him.



Private Theodore Schuler

Force: Canadian Infantry Unit: 14th Battalion. Enlisted with 34th Battalion, transferred to the 23rd Battalion and then to the 14th Battalion.

He was in France for about 3 weeks when he was reported missing on June 3, 1916.

Died of shrapnel wounds on his side and back.

John suffered multiple wounds and eventually his health deteriorated and he died at the Kings Canadian Red Cross Special Hospital in England.
