Waterloo Region - During this unprecedented time, when stress on artists and arts organizations is at an all-time high, the Region of Waterloo Arts Fund is finding new ways to support our Region's arts sector. The Arts Fund is committed to supporting the arts throughout this troubled time. Plays, concerts, tours, exhibitions, book launches, readings, festivals and workshops — as well all the behind-the-scenes work to create, mount and celebrate the arts — have been suspended. Closures and layoffs, as well as the imposed policies and procedures required for our health and safety, will affect creators in our region for a long time to come, in ways that will only become clear as we slowly return to our “new normal.”

We applaud the diversity of approaches that we already see happening, and look forward to all the ways, large and small, that our artists and arts organizations will devise to support the communities in which our art happens.

The Region of Waterloo Arts Fund, to support artists and arts organizations in Waterloo Region, is adjusting some of our protocols and deadlines.
