#### BACKGROUND

- Project Impetus
  - March 2019 Region of Waterloo petition for legal outlets following 2017 contract for improvements along Notre Dame Drive and Snyder's Road East
  - Spring 2019 and prior years- Drainage Superintendent discussions with landowners re. drainage concerns and needs
- Appointment by Council
  - June 2019 Council appoints K. Smart Associates
  - Objective new report for Petersburg Drain to address Section 4 petition provide improvements per Section 78



#### BACKGROUND- DRAINAGE ACT

- Ontario Statute that provides a process for the construction and maintenance of communal drainage works on private lands and public roads
- Broad range of applicability (urban/rural, large/small, etc.)
- Drainage infrastructure under Drainage Act referred to as "municipal drains"
- Public process (multiple opportunities for landowner input)
- Allocation of Costs (Assessments)










- Main Drain changes

#### ESTIMATED COST OF PETERSBURG DRAIN 2024

ITEM	COST
MAIN DRAIN	\$822,515
BRANCH B	\$457,115
BRANCH B-1	\$90,370
TOTAL EST.	\$1,370,000





## COST SHARING per DRAINAGE ACT

- S. 21, drain cost must be assessed
- Amount of assessment generally based on 2 factors:
  - Benefit derived ``Benefit assessment`` (S. 23)
  - Flow contribution ``Outlet assessment`` (S. 22)
- Lands and roads assessed for the portion of the drain used.
- Increased construction cost due to road or utility is assessed to that authority per S. 26. ``Special Assessment``



#### ASSESSMENT CONSIDERATIONS

- Outlet assessment
  - Property size?
  - Relative runoff amount?
- Benefit assessment
  - Proximity to drainage works?
  - Does drain provide direct outlet/connection point, improved drainage or reduced erosion?
  - Does drain "cutoff" flow that would otherwise impact property?
- How much of the system does a property make use of?



## ASSESSMENT CONSIDERATIONS (cont.)

- Allowances under the Drainage Act
  - Compensation to property owners for:
    Right-of-way for construction and future maintenance (S. 29)

Damages to crops, fences, lawns (S. 30)

Calculation of estimated net assessments
 Gross Assessment – Allowances = Net Assessment

REGION	29.2%
RAILROAD	2.1%
MTO	3.7%
DITCH ENCLOSURE LANDOWNER	31.0%
ALL OTHER LANDOWNERS	21.9%

Township levies final cost	TBD (2026?)
